Julian Stallabrass is Reader at the Courtauld Institute of Art in London.

He lectures in modern and contemporary art, including postwar British art, the history of photography and new media art. Stallabrass is the author of Gargantua: Manufactured Mass Culture (Verso, 1996), High Art Lite: British Art in the 1990s (Verso, 1999), Internet Art: The Online Clash of Culture and Commerce (Tate Publications 2003), and Art Incorporated (Oxford, 2004)—recently reissued as A Very Short Introduction to Contemporary Art. He is now working on a book about photography, politics and memory and his JC-I lecture will air a portion of that research.
