Qualifications: Applicants will have a B.A. Major, Diploma, or Honours degree in Art History or

equivalent, and be enrolled in or entering a graduate program in Art History or Critical and

Curatorial Studies.

**Duties:** Must attend weekly lectures; may conduct weekly seminars, discussion groups, or tutorials;

may assist with marking as well as with the preparation of course materials and assignments for students enrolled in the course; may hold office hours. Duties vary according to course level and type, and according to each instructor's expectations and

needs, but cannot exceed the hours designated in the TA's contract.

Hours of work: A full teaching assistantship involves an average of twelve (12) hours per week for the

winter session (September 1 to April 30), for a total of 384 hours. The salary for a partial teaching assistantship shall be calculated on a pro-rata basis.
